Meanwhile the Earth Hour Village in Monreal, Masbate is one of the first sustainable communities in the Philippines.

2. Our 120 Initiatives

Centred on Sun Life's 120th Year of operations in the Philippines, the Foundation spearheaded 3 different projects that involved both the company and its work force. In response to the devastating Typhoon Haiyan of 2013, 120 Boats and 120 Classrooms gave back a source of livelihood and education infrastructure to communities directly affected by one of the greatest calamities to take place in the Philippines. Meanwhile, 120 Rays of Giving Back engaged both employee and advisor force in spreading joy










ROSANEL ESQUILON

Educators dream of brighter lives not just for themselves but also for every student under their wings. Just like Ronald, Sun Life Foundation also yearned to provide the children a more conducive place for learning. Thus, together with its implementing partner, Children' Hour, it launched Project 120 Classrooms in 2013 and has since been building classrooms in disaster-stricken areas including Tacloban, Cebu, Aklan, and Iloilo.

Today, Ronald conducts classes in a safe and comfortable environment, and he and his student can look to the future with a smile.

Wilma is one of the women leaders of the Legacy of Light Village, Sun Life Foundation's model relocation community in Calauan, Laguna managed by ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation under its BayaniJuan program. Finding empowerment in her new community, Wilma has emerged as an effective leader, looking after close to a hundred homeowners who now enjoy decent homes and various livelihood opportunities - a significant improvement from their previous informal settlement along the esteros of Pasig River.

Brighter days are coming for Nanay Aurelia, who once suffered from cataracts that clouded her eyes and affected her vision. JOYCE BINWAG



PASTOR ARSENIO CACLIONG







Program giving

Over the years the Macaulay Club has contributed substantially to the different projects and initiatives supported by Sun Life Foundation. This elite club of change makers have contributed to funding school infrastructure, long term scholarships, and accessibility to education post Typhoon Haiyan.



Education

Project 120 Classrooms

Started in 2014 as a response to Typhoon Haiyan rebuilding efforts, Sun Life Foundation embarked on a project to construct 120 classrooms in areas most devastated by the super typhoon. Building 120 classrooms to mark 120 years of Sun Life in the Philippines, the project has seen a total of 92 classrooms inaugurated, and targets completion of all 120 classrooms in 2019.

TRANSFORM is a 16-week training curriculum that provides education to strengthen families in the key areas of values, health and livelihood. In conjunction with this program, Family Academy provides children with personalised one-on-one learning sessions in the home. Both programs ensure holistic development for both parents and children of the beneficiary families.

Infants and children who are malnourished or underweight are given monthly feedings, medical check ups, and milk rations.
